

## All Saints Thornton Hough Passiontide Service March 2020

This is the order of service for Sunday March 29<sup>th</sup> which we would have shared together if it were not for the pandemic. The hyperlinks in the text will take you to the readings (which you can read or have read to you) and to the music, most of which is sung by Wells Cathedral Choir. The prayers are taken from material produced by the Church of England for use during the pandemic and for Passiontide. ## 2. Introduction

The Fifth Sunday of Lent traditionally marks the beginning of Passiontide, and the Bible readings anticipate the story of Christ's suffering and death. The reading of the Passion narrative gave the Fifth Sunday of Lent its name of Passion Sunday. This service follows the account of the Passion in St John's Gospel with music from Bob Chilcott's *St John's Passion*.

3. Prayers (including a confession)

Christ himself carried up our sins in his body to the tree, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds we have been healed.

Peter 2.2.

O God, you know my foolishness and my sins are not hidden from you:
Lord, have mercy.
Let not the flood overwhelm me nor the depths swallow me up; let not the pit shut its mouth upon me:
Christ, have mercy.
Hear me, O Lord, as your loving kindness is good; turn to me as your compassion is great:
Lord, have mercy.

Most merciful God, who by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ delivered and saved the world: grant that by faith in him who suffered on the cross we may triumph in the power of his victory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.
